When comparing the numbers of claim denials and procedures not covered by insurance for North Carolinians in this poll with recent data from Kaiser Family Foundation on denials, North Carolinians are seeing higher denial rates than the national average.

Health Insurance Denials Erode Patient Satisfaction

23.1%	had a procedure not covered by insurance
20.1%	had a claim denied
16%	had to go through unnecessary paperwork to get treatment in the last two years
73.6%	of those who had a claim denied reported feeling dissatisfied with their insurance company with most of those <mark>being extremely dissatisfied</mark> ,

Respondents who said they had a health procedure not covered by the insurance company or received a surprise bill also saw their dissatisfaction levels increase by a factor of two.
